# Community Foundation of Kherson "Zakhyst" Anual Report - 2024



### **Introductory Note**

The year 2024 was challenging for all of Ukraine — and especially difficult for Kherson and its people, who continue to live there despite everything: under daily and nightly enemy shelling and airstrikes.

Kherson is a Hero City because its people are Heroes.

Throughout the responded year, we systematically to the needs of Kherson and its providing residents assistance to individuals, supporting the restoration of infrastructure, damaged and aiding emergency response services.

Our second focus was strengthening communication with Kherson residents, wherever they may be — in Kherson, in other regions of Ukraine, or abroad.

The main tool for this has been the web platform "Hear the Kherson Community", but offline events with Kherson residents in Kyiv were also organized. One of the key objectives of these meetings was to develop a vision for postwar Kherson.

In response to some criticisms that "now is not the time," we say — tomorrow that time will come, and we must be ready!

We sincerely thank all the benefactors who contributed to our programs and initiatives through donations, transportation services, their time, as well as professional and intellectual efforts.

#### Support for Kherson Residents: Care in Difficult Times

The Community Foundation of Kherson "Zakhyst" completed the winter assistance program, which was launched in 2023 with financial support from ChildFund Deutschland e.V.

The program aimed to help warm those who remained in poorly heated or entirely unheated homes.

Thanks to the program, in January–February 2024: 1 271 Kherson residents received sets of warm clothing (wool vests, felt boots, and thermal underwear), 360 wool blankets and 372 solar-powered lamps were distributed, 48 Kherson families received water filters, 63 tons of fuel briquettes were delivered to residents.

The total German assistance budget for the program in 2024 amounted to UAH 2 674 587.



In 2024, our Foundation also organized the delivery of humanitarian aid to residents of the Kherson region in cooperation with the National Network for the Development of Local Philanthropy and ShelterBox. During January and February, 620 residents received essential kits, including dishware, hygiene products, bedding sets, and materials to repair windows damaged by shelling.

The total value of this assistance amounted to UAH 1 920 586,94.

We sincerely thank ChildFund Deutschland, the National Network for the Development of Local Philanthropy, and ShelterBox for supporting Kherson residents during the difficult wartime winter. We believe this assistance warmed our fellow citizens not only physically but also emotionally.

#### **Light for Kherson Residents**

The enemy continues to destroy the energy infrastructure, leaving residents without electricity. The Community Foundation of Kherson "Zakhyst" consistently supports the restoration of damaged facilities.

**7** street transformers have been provided to the city, the latest in 2024 valued at 350,000 UAH. It is already operating, supplying electricity to six apartment buildings.

**51,500** UAH was allocated for consumables and tools needed to repair power lines operated by Municipal Enterprise "KhersonMiskSvitlo".

An innovative project – an uninterrupted power supply (UPS) system for one of Kherson's hospitals, valued at UAH 773,205. During surgeries, the lights didn't even flicker! The UPS system is a real solution for any hospital under conditions of frequent power outages — and in Kherson, also under constant shelling. The trust placed in the Community Foundation of Kherson "Zakhyst" by both Ukrainian businesses and international donors made it possible to install this vital system at a local hospital.

#### Support for Medical Institutions of Kherson

In 2024, our program "Saving Kherson Together: Medicine" continued to save lives and support Kherson's medical institutions under constant shelling.

Every day, Kherson's medical workers save lives despite ongoing threats. Thanks to this support, they receive the necessary resources for their work, and hospitals are able to continue operating even in extreme conditions.

**Key Achievements:** 

• Cleaning Supplies and Construction Materials for Hospitals:

One hospital received half a ton of European-grade cleaning supplies for medical facilities and 1.2 tons of construction mixtures for ongoing repairs of damaged premises. Another medical institution received 42 bags of mineral plaster and 42 bags of adhesive filler, with a total value of 45 700 62 UAH.

• Medical Equipment and Instruments:

On June 28, we delivered urgently needed specialized medical needles to a hospital, valued at 19 721 UAH.

# Calendar "My Kherson Through the Eyes of Oleksandr Stepanenko": Art for the Sake of Aid

Even during the war, the Community Foundation of Kherson "Zakhyst" continues to unite Kherson residents. In partnership with like-minded individuals, we created a unique charitable calendar, "My Kherson Through the Eyes of Artist Oleksandr Stepanenko," which has become a symbol of the hometown for Kherson residents around the world. The project brought Kherson residents together:

- Artist and architect Oleksandr Stepanenko, who remained in occupied Kherson, contributed his paintings depicting views of the old city.
- Designer Maksym Afanasiev and entrepreneur Mykhailo Orel, who relocated his printing business to Kyiv, also joined the calendar's creation.

**Results:** 

- The calendar was distributed in exchange for donations, which enabled the purchase of three medical aspirators for a Kherson hospital, totaling UAH 89,100.
- The publication became a real bridge connecting Kherson residents: its pages, showcasing views of their beloved city, reached various parts of Ukraine and countries abroad including the USA, Poland, Lithuania, Germany, and the Czech Republic.

#### Web Platform "Hear the Kherson Community": Uniting in Times of Crisis

The full-scale invasion by Russia pushed the Kherson community to the brink of survival.

Due to the war, one-third of Kherson's residents were forced to leave the city, increasing the demand for reliable information to objectively assess the situation.

In April 2023, with the support of the USAID/ENGAGE grant project, the Foundation launched the web platform "Hear the Kherson Community" and continued its development in 2024.

#### **Putting Kherson Residents' Voices First**

Fulfilling our role as a community foundation, The Foundation used the results of these we placed special emphasis on studying the studies in its work to plan and implement problems, needs, and concerns of Kherson initiatives aimed at providing humanitarian residents. To this end, we actively used a tool support to Kherson residents, strengthening unique for Ukraine's civil society sector – the community cohesion, and consolidating the Kherson Community Research Online Panel. With the help of expert sociologists, this businesses in ensuring the city's resilience platform enabled us to conduct 23 public and recovery. opinion studies in 2024, exploring various

- aspects of city life, including:
  - socio-economic situation
  - migration and demographics
  - education
  - community cohesion
  - information behavior
  - values and identity of Kherson residents.

In total, around 9,000 respondents took part in the surveys - both those who remained in Kherson and those who were forced to relocate within Ukraine or abroad, yet still maintained their connection to the city and continued to feel part of the community.



#### Forum "Kherson - the City Where Life Prevails."

On September 16–17, in Kyiv, the Community Foundation of Kherson "Zakhyst" brought together representatives of civil society and charitable organizations, educators, journalists, business leaders, and government officials from the Kherson region at the Forum "Kherson – the City Where Life Prevails."

The event gathered Kherson residents from across Ukraine, including those from the frontline city itself, as well as representatives of the authorities. The Forum began with a moment of silence to honor the memory of fallen heroes who gave their lives for Ukraine's independence.

Ahead of the Forum, four strategic sessions were held, focused on shaping a vision for Kherson's future. Despite ongoing shelling, the Hero City continues to live, and participants discussed key challenges, opportunities, and ways to rebuild the community.

The Forum became not just a platform for discussions but also a catalyst for real change. Already on September 23, following the event, Kherson entrepreneurs initiated the creation of the Kherson Business Association, recognizing that business is a driving force behind economic recovery, infrastructure rebuilding, and encouraging people to return to the city.

The Forum confirmed: Kherson is fighting, developing, and preparing for revival!







### **Open Annual Meeting**

On March 13, 2024, the Community Foundation of Kherson "Zakhyst" celebrated 21 years of activity. On this day, an open annual meeting was held in Kyiv, bringing together members of the organization and Kherson residents who were forced to leave the city due to the war.

The event served not only as an opportunity to report to the community on the humanitarian initiatives implemented in 2023 but also as a warm gathering that helped our fellow citizens find emotional relief.

Hugs, smiles, and shared memories made this evening truly special, reminding everyone that Kherson is not just a place on the map - it is, above all, the people who support one another, no matter where they are.


